The new term is well underway now and lots of new things are taking place at REA.

House System

This is a way of organising pupils so that they work together as a group, support each other and compete against other Houses. We have 4 Houses – Al Ali, Al Huroub, Kanafani, Touqan – named after significant Palestinian people. Each pupil has been placed in a House with a Captain and Vice Captain. These were voted by the House and this process introduced the idea of democracy and elections to pupils.

The aim is to get as many points for the House throughout the year through events, merits in class for good work, notable achievements. Of course they can also lose points through not wearing correct uniform, poor behaviour etc. One role of the House Captains and Vice Captains is to encourage the House members to 'do the right things'.

It is now not only teachers who encourage high standards, but also the other pupils in the school.

CIE

When I joined REA I knew from the start that Cambridge would be keen to have us join them. They acknowledge the quality we have already established and we are now in a position to offer IGCSE exams and A Levels as the school grows



Term 2 Projects

As expected these are proving very popular with pupils and staff. They are allowing pupils to express their knowledge skills and understanding of topics in a way that examinations do not. They get an opportunity to work together to compile a piece of work and they can create their own finished product. Projects like these put them in control of their own learning rather than being controlled by an examination paper.

School Uniform

During the winter months school uniform always becomes an issue with children feeling the change in weather in different ways. We have some pupils in shirt sleeves and others dressed in Arctic survival clothes. This is perfectly acceptable, but please ensure that SCHOOL TROUSERS, SKIRTS, SHIRTS and JUMPERS are worn for indoors. We have many visitors to school and I want the correct impression of the school to be on show at all times.
